\$150,000 MISSION GRANTS PAID

TLC Preschool, operated by Trinity Lutheran Church in Casa Grande, Arizona was one of the last mission grants paid last year. It is 1 of 3 Christian preschools out of 12 in the growing community. Funding will equip TLC Preschool to purchase the much needed equipment to operate the additional classrooms.



Lutheran Church at the Well received a partial mission grant to support a newly planted mission church in the Antelope Valley. The funds will be used to purchase technology equipment and to develop a website to spread the Gospel to unchurched and dechurched in this rapidly growing and young area of north LA County.



The other partial mission grant paid will be used to write and produce a radio program for children and perform children's concerts as an outreach to the community in the Las Vegas area.

Break Forth With Song

"By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion. There on the poplars we hung our harps, for there our captors asked us for songs, our tormentors demanded songs of joy; they said "Sing us one of the songs of Zion!" How can we sing the songs of the LORD while in a foreign land?"
Psalm 137:1-4

Most of us connect singing with times of joy and celebration. Like the people of God who had been exiled in Babylon, we find it nearly impossible to sing under duress. Perhaps the meditative season of Lent is a good opportunity for us to reflect on our district LWML theme topics for the biennium, Sing to the Lord – A Song for Every Heart, and for the upcoming convention, Sing to the Lord.

We may spend much of our time during Lent reflecting on the Lord's suffering and sacrifice on our behalf, leading us to thoughts of our own unworthiness and sin.

How could we consider breaking into song with such heavy thoughts? Prayer Book Plans

The Christian Life Committee of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) is preparing a booklet of prayers similar to *A Woman's Praying Heart,* produced in 2007 and available at www.lwml.org. We invite you to write one or more prayers to submit for possible inclusion in this new prayer booklet. Prayers might be written for the following suggested categories (you might think of other categories):

- 1. Physical changes in your life (health issues, depression, etc.)
- 2. Environmental changes (moving, help with cooking, cleaning, etc.)
- 3. Relationship changes (family issues, dependence on friends, etc.)
- 4. Faith changes (more reliance on the Lord, forgiveness, facing death, etc.)

About 100 prayers will be chosen by the committee and all would be anonymous. You may chose a Scripture on which to base your prayer, which may not be more than 250 words long, including the Bible passage. All prayers will go to the Lutheran Church -Missouri Synod for doctrinal review.

Please submit your prayer either as a Word document attached to an e-mail (preferred) or typed and sent by U.S. mail to Karen Duprey. Deadline is April 1, 2010.
